The most endangered leopard subspecies, the **Amur leopard** is native to the Russian Far East and Northeast China.

The population of Amur leopards reached a low point in the 1970s due to habitat loss, poaching and human-wildlife conflict with numbers estimated as few as 30 individuals.

Now the population is increasing due to the efforts of conservationists and governments. The latest estimates suggest there are **over 100 Amur leopards in the wild.**

WildCats Conservation Alliance works with zoos around the world to raise significant funds to support this population recovery through projects that reduce threats and encourage safe coexistence with people.
